A definite 5 starrer, The Social Network is a perfect mix of a great script followed by great direction and acting. Aaron Sorkin with his script and Trent Reznor with his score have done a near perfect job in this flick. Starting with the obsession of Mark (Jesse Eisenberg) wanting to get into the Harvard's elite final clubs. The whole character of Mark is summed up in what his girlfriend tells him when she breaks up with him in the initial parts of the story.


Seeking revenge on his girlfriend he creates a site called facemash that allows people to rank women who are hot and who are not. The popularity of the site increases to such an extent that the Harvard server crashes and Mark is called before the disciplinary committee.

The Winklevoss twins, Cameron and Tyler and Divya

Narendra notice this and ask Mark to set up a Harvard only dating site. Though Mark agrees to do so, he delays the project and it is later found that he is doing so because he is busy with his own social networking site – Facebook.

The movie brings forth the controversy about whose initial idea was to create the Facebook social network. Whether the idea was borrowed from the twins and whether Eduardo was cast aside after the initial investment are all ideas that are dealt with but left unanswered.

The movie also captures the impact of the Internet and social networking on our lives in a very effective manner - A must see for all Facebookers, which pretty much means everyone!

Based on a novel 'A Very Private Gentleman', Anton Corbijn's The American is an interesting thriller. The main character Jack played by George Clooney can clearly be defined by the title of the book. The movie portrays the life of an assassin paid for hire in a completely different manner than what we know from previous movies. The hi-tech gadgets, swanky cars and the luxurious lifestyle are missing.

Jack is shown to be in hiding in a small town in

Italy in between jobs to ensure that the heat on the first one subsides. All that he is shown doing as he whiles away his time is push-ups, stare out of the window, visit a local priest (Father Benedetto played by Paolo Bonacelli) and engage in some entertainment with the local prostitute Clara (played by Viollante Placido).

Even as this gentleman knows that relationships and attachments can lead into issues, his defense gets weaker as he gets a taste of some genuine love to such an extent that he wants out of the 'death delivery' business. He is promised that after his last assignment to create a specific firearm that will help in assassinating another mysterious assassin (played by Thekla Reuten).

But the whole thing gets messy as the Swedes are out to get him!

This modern thriller movie has an ascetic and severe setting, much like the main character himself. The shots are long and static and while these are a nice change from the quick in-and-out Bond movies, the background of the Italian landscape makes the movie a bit dull in places.

If you are going to catch this movie, do not expect a standard Hollywood thriller since it has none of the standard stuff like the fast racy car scenes or intense explosions. What you are likely to get instead is the silent treatment of a gunshot in beautiful environs, causing death and the intense desire to get out of the death industry.
