












We now present to you our very own hot list - welcome to StarCentral magazine's sexiest and most fascinating people in the world 2010!

support group for young women. This website will be called MyGirl and will feature music from herself and other local inspirational female artists, as well as offer information on various issues affecting young women of today.





Sexiest Man Of The Year Rayden Lee





"On one gig we played our version of Hallelujah and many persons began to cry...that was a really nice moment." The trio has made a name for themselves in their hometown and of course, dreams of reaching a much wider audience. Their YouTube channel is another step toward that dream. At the moment, their music consists of mainly acoustic covers of songs such as 'Just The Way You are' by Bruno Mars; 'Hero' by Enrique Iglesias; 'Misery' by Maroon 5 and even 'Pokerface' by Lady Gaga. But in December 2010 they launched their first original song on the site, 'Sehnsucht', translated as 'longing', 'yearning' or 'craving'.

The music itself is what inspires Ground Zero and when people are touched by it, "...it's a really good feeling..."

Their drive to keep creating and playing music will guarantee that this young band's future in the industry will be a long one.




JoshPetherick
