




editor's notes

Once you have all this, the Lawyer will then ask for a payment in the region from \$5000-\$10 000! One of the most highly recommended lawyers is George Giosmas Lawyers, and if you go with them, its going to cost you in the region of \$6000.

- 1. The first thing you're going to need is ten (or more) reference letters from people within the entertainment industry (acting coaches, teachers, directors, colleagues, producers and so on). These need to be professionals who you have worked with and who are going to make you sound HOT, HOT, HOT!
- 2. Phew! After that's all done, the second thing is extremely easy! You just need to have a copy of your
- Job offer/contract for US work in the field of acting. This can seem very daunting but trust that you have a contact who will come through for you. The contract usually comes from a friend of a friend and doesn't need to be seen through. Its more of a failsafe so

- 4. Ok this one requires work! You're going to need a proposed itinerary of events for the next three years. This is to show the USA that you're passionate about moving to their country and are willing to put the work in. Also note, the O1 Visa can be attained for a maximum of 3 years.
- 5. Press materials. Any articles or newspaper clippings you have been included in. They need to be paper copies, so if you only have websites then head over to www.paperworld.com.au and get ordering!
- 6. Another easy one, which you should already have anyway! Copies of your best Headshots, CV and Resume.
- 7. Previous contracts. So. any contracts you have from the acting/modelling work you've done in the past. You should all have copies of your contacts saved so this final step should be nice and easy!

Once your Lawyers receive all of this, they put together your personal case package. They then send a copy to the SAG to validate you and your Visa petition. SAG will then [hopefully] issue a document stating you are worthy of an O1 Visa. YAY! They will then send this entire package to Immigration to validate. The whole process can take up to three months and its definitely something you can't rush. Now I've told you what to do, the rest is up to you.

Whether you love to hate, or, love to love models there's always one question which instantaneously springs to mind.... What do they eatl?!

It's easy to think of models like some kind of beautiful alien life force, who've been put on this planet with one primary goal; to make all the mere mortals feel bad about themselves. But do not fear! I've braved an interview with one certain alien and asked all the gritty questions about diet and the occasional naughty indulgences. Surprisingly, it's not all that alien at all!

Ebony Wright of Jeep Model Management is a model/dancer extraordinaire. She has recently been seen strutting her fabulous self all over the Sydney Hair Expo runways and you would probably recognise her from a number of swimwear, clothing and advertisement campaigns. Luckily for StarCentral, this seriously sexy model/alien found time to give us the inside scoop, or should I say portion controlled serving. Keep reading to see exactly what this model will eat during a standard day.

Lets start with breakfast - allegedly the most important meal of the day and according to Wright, it really is! She routinely has parridge sprinkled with quinoa flakes made on almond milk. All organic of course, accompanied by her only piece of fruit all day (never a banana) and a glass of warm water with lemon. After her meal, she religiously takes her Vitamins: Fish oil, Vitamin C, Coenzyme Q10, Probiotic (Kefer). Wright says "I only ever have one piece of fruit all day because its so high in sugar... I love taking my Vitamin C because its great for collagen production."

Dinner is usually a variation of the same combination: lean meat and vegetables. Chicken stir-fry with brown rice or simply protein and steamed vegetables. "I try and eat fish as much as possible, if I can't have fish it's chicken or lean beef." Wright also says she loves having "...dark green and red vegetables for dinner capsicum, spinach, kale, sweet potato and zucchini. Unfortunately I don't eat mushrooms any longer because of their high acidity."

If Wright is ever in the mood for a sweet treat (yes, you can even have dessert!) she will turn to a raw, vegan tart or indulge in some cocanut vegan yoghurt. Of her diet, Wright swears she eats every three hours and makes sure she drinks at least two litres of water everyday.

By creating this event they are also creating a culture surrounding that brand – which is far more effective when it comes to engaging your target audience.

"The Atticism" is actually the brain child of Renae Smith who lives in Newtown, Sydney. Renae worked in the legal industry for 15 years; owning her own business for 6 years and also reporting directly to the Chairman of a large national law firm at the same time. In her 'spare time', Renae assists several other companies with their brand direction, events, creative direction, model sourcing and spansorship sales. After having several organisations commend her for her unique approach and level of professionalism, she then decided to begin her own consultancy. It was obvious to her from these conversations that there was a market for her unique skill base. The experience she had gained from being an alternative industry model, combined with years of high level professional training, gave her the ability to assist these 'urban' companies in reaching their target audience uniquely, yet at a professionally high standard - often not associated with this demographic.





So you've made the decision that you want to be a model. Ok, that means you've got to start eating, exercising and thinking like one. No more late night trips to Max Brenner (awwww). Make sure you start hitting the gym, yoga or any other exercise which will firm up those pesky tuckshop lady arms. Even if you want to get into plus size modelling - you've gotta be firm people! Most importantly BE CONFIDENT, believe in your ability. Don't tell people you're 'trying' to become a model, tell them you ARE a model.

Fit and healthy - check! Now its time to really get into the fun stuff!

First things first - whenever you are going to approach ANYONE in the industry, the first thing they'll ask you for is your look-book or portfolio. And I'll tell you what, those happy snaps taken last Christmas just ain't going to cut it! You need to build a professional portfolio, which can usually cost upwards of \$600! But don't fret -websites like Starnow and Model Mayhem are fantastic places to get into contact with photographers, makeup artists, stylists, the list could go on. Like you, they're working on expanding or building their portfolio too so usually the artists on these kinds of platforms work on a TFP (time for photos) basis. Basically, all parties give up their time and everyone gets a free copy of all images taken and usually some touched up photos. TFP shoots are also a great way to network and get advice from people who may be more experienced than you. Always try to make triends with the people you work with. You never know what doors they could open for you.

Now that you are a model with an amazing look-book, it's time to start approaching agents. Send a concise, friendly and professional email to all the agents you're interested in, along with six killer photos. Always ask for other people's advice on the photos you send. Usually, the photos you like of yourself aren't the best choices. Email your dream agents first and always ask for their advice on your look. If none of those are interested, don't give up. Remember, Tyra Banks was rejected from seven agencies before she was signed! It's incredibly competitive out there, so don't be disheartened by a few rejections.

I guess the questions at the end of all that is; is it all worth it? There is no doubt modelling is a tough and sometimes nasty industry, however, when you're in - its a whole lot of fun!

EEEK! You've just received a call from your agent telling you in four days you've got an audition. After you sprint around the house twenty times, eat a Mars Bar in 3 seconds flat and tweet #omgsoexcitedicoulddie.... The dreaded thought kicks in - WHAT AM I GOING TO DO NOW!!? Don't panic! This step by step guide can ease all those pre-audition nerves.

Step 1

Read the whole script first. I know what you're thinking -DERRRR! However, you'd be amazed how many actors just jump straight into trying to analyse as they read a script for the first time!

Step 2

Break it down now! And I don't mean in that cool, hiphopopotomas kind of way. Breaking down your script is so important. Otherwise, how are you supposed to know who you are as the character!? It may seem time consuming but trust me, it really does work!

Step 3

Don't follow the leader! Greg Apps from Greg Apps Casting recently posted on Facebook how great actors don't simply follow the directions given to them. Think of the staging directions as more of a basis to improvise. Do what you think the character would do. After all, that's what makes it YOUR character.

Step 4

Lights, Camera, Action! Practice (but not to the point of regurgitation) and film yourself so you can see exactly what the Casting Director is going to see. This is great to see any little habits you never knew you had. There is no excuse not to do this, even if you don't have a smartphone (which I very much doubt), you'll surely have a mirror to look into!
