

What do you do when you're in an audition and the panel asks you to take off your sh*t and do the scene nude? What happens when a director is calling you at all hours of the night for no good reason? What happens when you're about to get your make-up done and you can physically see a worm squelching around in the bottom of the alleged 'clean' water bottle? As someone who has lived through all of these scenarios, I can tell you exactly what to do - you say NO!

As young actors and actresses we often feel pressured to do exactly as those in charge tell us to do. We feel that we need to be totally flexible and open to whatever creativity they might inflict upon us. This is generally a good thing, no one like a precious little princess on set. However, when your hygiene or personal safely is in danger, you need to speak up!

If you ever feel like you're in a situations where you're lizard brain is telling you that something is really not ok then you have every right to let the 1st AD know that you don't feel comfortable doing what they've asked. Now, I don't mean things like, 'umm excuse me but this seat isn't very comfortable' or, 'Oh I can't wear a yellow shirt because I don't like yellow.' No, these are not even close to uncomfortable situations. Uncomfortable situations are when alarm bells go off in your brain and in your gut telling you that whatever is happening, probably shouldn't be! When approaching TFP jobs you should be especially cautious too, after all anyone can put up an advertisement on Starnow. There are lots of stories of young talent being lured under false pretences to some nut jobs home for an 'audition'.

Food is another issue. Starving on a 8hour shoot without any food is totally not okay, after all you're not a model... You need to eat! Joking aside this is another example of a situation that is not ok. Especially of you're working for tree or TFP. Now I'm not saying go Mariah Carey on their ass, but a polite question about whether you can go and get something to eat or if you can make a sandwich is totally fine. You need not feel embarrassed or like a diva for asking about a mere sandwich.

Basically, it's all about remembering that when you're on a film set, whether it be a student film, indie or blockbuster you are still a human being, not just some guinea pig. You have the right to be comfortable and safe, always!

When Kylie Minogue's professional dancers were requested to work for no pay during filming of one of her recent video clips, public outcry and widespread news coverage ensued. However, situations similar to this have, and continue to be, an issue in the creative industries – often passing by unhindered and unreported. Indeed, working for little or no pay under the guise of "exposure" is becoming endemic. Companies that turn profit (and in some cases a whole lot of it) are able to hire talent for free simply because if one person turns down the work there are a whole host of others just waiting for that "special opportunity".

In the case of the Kylie Minogue story the dancers were outsourced, so her spokespeople was able to deflect blame. Had the dancers not reported the situation to the Media and Arts Entertainment Alliance (MEAA) then the issue could have easily slipped the radar. In this case, payment was largely reimbursed and this was no doubt due to the bad press. After all, Kylie is worth millions and she can't even pay professional dancers who have spent their life pursuing rigorous and very costly training? It makes a good news story, and, a massive PR disaster for the singing budgie.

But, what about those other cases that don't make a good news story? And, how about those castings and advertisements that are unspecific or even deceptive. It seems everyone is asking for Time for Print (TFP) work these days. TFP refers to work undertaken whereby creative parties equally devote their time to a project (traditionally print, but could be CD or anything else really) in an exchange of labour whereby the project can be produced. Or, put another way: collaboration.

It goes across all the creative mediums, whether you belong as a model; actor; photographer; writer; makeup artist; hair stylist; video producer (and possibly other job descriptions). If you are one of these things,

regardless of your skill level, I am willing to bet my pathetically unreliable writer's income that you have at some time or another been requested to work TFP, have possibly been misled by a job opportunity that does not in reality exist, or have been disappointed by the sad lack of actual paid work available in the world around you.

The problem is that the TFP method has been skewed in favour of companies and individuals using talent and getting around having to pay for it. Plain and simple, what you have here is exploitation. TFP work is to be undertaken explicitly for non-commercial purposes and model release forms should always be signed before a shoot that state exactly this. This means no party to the project should profit from the finished product – nothing should be "sold" as the project belongs to all who devoted their time in an exchange of expertise. TFP works brilliantly when the model's, photographer's and creative talent's visions and skill levels perfectly align.

TFP functions as great method of refreshing a portfolio at minimal to no cost. It is also clearly a great option when a creative talent is attempting to build up a portfolio. And, under those conditions only does it function beneficially. You see, people can't afford to donate limitless time, equipment and petrol expenditure (along with countless other hidden costs) without getting anything back. Although it may come as a shock to some of those of privilege in the industry, an expectation that someone provide never-ending TFP work is simply absurd.

Yes, there is mutual experience building, but there absolutely comes a point where one gains enough experience to deserve to be paid. You wouldn't expect a plumber to fix your pipes for free, so why should professional creatives be subject to the absolute rip otherwise known as "exposure"? And, the fact that someone with "stars in their eyes" (probably young, supported by their parents or less experienced)

will eagerly take your place means that it's getting harder and harder for anyone to stand their ground against the rising TFP tide.

Even if you avoid TFP for the main part, there are some other cons to watch out for. I'd suggest looking out for those sneaky "deferred payments". You can wonder if you will ever get paid, and I'd say you're wondering that for good reason. And, even if you do get paid, the question remains... how to survive in the meantime? Also, look out for the term "start up". Ask for the company's ABN to first find out if they are indeed legitimate; check their website; Google their name plus the word "scam"; contact ASIC; try to locate or ask for their fiscal report. Keep in mind that having an agent doesn't necessarily keep you safe from scams and the like. In fact, agencies often provide primo examples of scamming operations. Always do your research!

Just to divert a little from the main point of this article (but it would be irresponsible not to include this issue) – it's possibly even more dangerous when dealing with illegitimate individuals than it is with shady or exploitative companies, especially on a personal level. The term "Guy with Camera" or GWC refers to a creep/criminal who is out to exploit people (yes, mainly young women). We don't really need to go into what this kind of person would do with the images...one can surely imagine. Always trust your gut and employ commonsense safety measures – just as you would do when meeting any stranger or anyone that you barely know in any situation where you could potentially feel exposed.

What to do if a company that makes a profit didn't pay you or deceived you out of pay? You can join the union (The MEAA as mentioned previously) and make a report – just like Kylie Minogue's back up dancers did. You can contact The Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (ACCC). You lodge a scam report form online. You can find information on the SCAMwatch website on how to contact your local Consumer Affairs or Fair Trading authority. You can also report a dodgy company or individual to the site on which it was advertised – "Star Now" for example (who has recently somewhat improved their awareness and action on this front).

Remember to watch out for that little term "exposure". Ensure that in your case (should you pursue the opportunity it relates to) that it doesn't in fact mean "exploitation". The entertainment and arts industries face enough hefty battles (funding cuts etc.) without having to wage a civil war on top of it. Employ some integrity and common sense and as a creative person protect your craft and show it the recognition and respect that it deserves. Use TFP properly or not at all. Otherwise, you risk exploiting your passion, ambilion and talent and eroding the very industry that you endeavour to thrive within.

Time and time again, it is when things are at their darkest that a miracle happens. This is just the case with multi-talented performer, Andy Magro – "I was almost quitting my career, but thanks to the amazing David Cronenberg who believed in me and hired me for a little supporting role in his feature film 'A Dangerous Method' starring Keira Knightley, Viggo Mortensen and Michael Fassbender, I said to myself: Don't quit and give yourself another chance to shine."

Coming from a small town in Germany to being surrounded by some of Hollywood's finest actors was a life-changing event for Andy. Being chosen for the role of 'Jean Martin Freud' in the film has served to provide him with a constant source of inspiration and motivation. To have his talent recognized and singled out by one of the industry's most impressive directors pushes him to keep him improving in his craft, "you have to study all the time, because you are never too old to learn and you always learn new things." As part of his ongoing drive to excel, he has completed a five-month acting course at TAFTA (The Australian Film and TV Academy).

Andy got his start in the world of acting when at 13 years old he established his own drama/film class at his school. Since then, he has spread his wings to encompass many aspects of the entertainment industry. In addition to acting, this Germany-born Italian-American performer is also a singer (four new singles are available on iTunes and on CD as an EP-Edition this year) as well as a model. As a model, he is the face of three German jewelry brands – "Binder-FBM, Acredo and egf-wedding rings", as well as Frankfurt-based eye-laser-surgery company, "Care Vision Germany GmbH" and the Testimonial of a Swiss smartphone product called "Celltack".

And since moving to Rome, he has become an official supporter of the WWF (World Wildlife Fund) global campaign, 'Save Tigers Now' along with Oscar-nominated actor, Leonardo DiCaprio and is planning to raise more than 60.000 US\$ within 60 days together with other celebrities in order to protect these wonderful and endangered animals. Besides that he will donate 50% of his earnings from his debut-album (EP) to SOS-Kinderdorf to give as many kids as possible "... a lovely and adorable family and a place they can call home. I think every artist who creates public awareness thanks to his fame and even those who aren't famous or not famous yet should donate something to save as many lives as possible!"

For Andy, acting has afforded him to explore as much of the performing world as he can. He said he enjoys "being as creative as you want, setting you free and creating and exploring new characters for every different role." He loves making people laugh or cry or scream or to scare them when he's playing a character because then he knows that he did a good job, ".. if the audience get involved in the feelings and characters an actor plays and they really get an emotion because of that actor, then you are not an actor but an incredible amazing person with deep and real emotions". He further said that "the set, the cast and crew become your second family and after a while you just don't want to miss that special and unique feeling." Acting has also allowed him the opportunity of "travelling around the globe and seeing different kinds of nature, cultures and people. That's fantastic and I feel honored."

Andy's entertainment career has certainly been an impressive one. Mostly based in Europe, he has appeared in numerous German feature films, TV shows and series, short films, commercials and print ads. In Italy, he has done a short film playing next to Italian celebrity actor, Tony Sperandeo and the international acclaimed Italian music producer and pianist Maurizio Mastrini from Maurizio Mastrini Records (MPC International) has shown interest in distributing his debut-CD (EP) and singles in Summer 2014 on CD and iTunes.

He also said that he is currently working on his first album which will contain Italian, Spanish and English pop/RnB songs. His next song will be called "No Turning Back and his first music video will be shot in June 2014." There is also an international feature film in pre-production "Kid in the Box – The Last House in the Woods 2" directed by Gabriele Albanesi. It is the sequel of the 2006-released movie which received international attention thanks to Minerva.

Andy bounces back and forth between Europe, Australia and Los Angeles in pursuit of his dreams. But he knows that he would have no chance of furthering his career without the help and support of not only his family and friends, but that of his acting coaches and business partners – "without them I wouldn't be that person, artist and talent that I am now." This multi-lingual (he speaks Italian, English, German and Spanish) and multi-talented artist has Hollywood in his sights. Big plans are under way to make Los Angeles his base, and to once again find himself alongside some of Tinseltown's finest.

You're so comfortable in your own skin that you do things your don't realise. Everyone on the planet does it! THE INSTANT WAY TO BURN BELLY FAT FAST

You don't remember the jeans being so tight around your waist. Suddenly you have a muffin top that wasn't there yesterday. And, in that dress you now feel a lot more conscious of your mid-region? How did it happen so quickly? More importantly – what can you do about to reverse this, as soon as you possibly can?

Well, diet is the obvious answer and you would need to have a good hard look at what you have been eating and drinking of late. Sometimes when weight gain is so sudden you need to have a look at lifestyle. It's harder to say no around Christmas and Easter time, at social events and while travelling. Sometimes relaxing and having a bit more fun then usual can tip you over the edge – from your normal size to something you are less comfortable with.

It's amazing how rapidly it all happens, and while it might start to be felt in other areas, abdominal fat is one of the first areas to which lifestyle factors manifest. Actually, I found myself quite fascinated with the science behind the procedure. You see, the treatment breaks down fat cells via an ultrasound (this being comprised of acoustic waves.) Applied to the selected area the waves target only the fatty cells (or Triglycerides) and are unable to damage skin, tissue, nerves, blood vessels or anything other than the fat. A combination of heat and vibrations prove too intense for the membranes of these fat cells and they are broken down and released into the intestinal fluid. This process is otherwise known as "lipolysis". Or, as I'd like to think of it – "melting the fat".

From here, you have a separation of what used to be fat into glycerol and fatty acids. Glycerol (water soluble) is passed through the intestinal fluids, is excreted as waste and is also metabolised by the liver. The fatty acids go by way of the liver. So, what you have here is an elimination of toxins.

What are the caveats of the treatment? You must be in good health so that your body can dispose of these toxins quickly and efficiently, you must be prepared to eat healthily and you should be prepared to drink 8 glasses of water per day. Hydration is key: the glycerol and fatty acids need to be dispelled or they will once again be used to create Triglycerides (or, as we learnt earlier) the fat that you so badly want gone.

So, what about the procedure itself... well, put aside an hour for a session. It does get a little hot and there is a slight ringing sensation in the ears. But, altogether it's very easy, and there's a nice slice of time to spend in the sauna afterward. Discomfort is slight. My tummy was a little red afterward, however, this is to be expected. The reason why I'd say the trial was a success? Well, because of the measurements – clearly. But, it's more than this. The reduced size around my mid-section was enough of a confident boost to set me on the right path. Having invested in my body and my well being, I continued with a healthy diet and a raised consciousness about my hydration levels. I view the treatment as a relatively, quick, easy and painless tool to assist a successful weight loss or fitness journey.

It means a lot to feel that bit less bloated or flabby or whatever the case may be. There's a lot to be said for mindset and the relief of being able to refrain from having to buy clothing in that next size cannot be underestimated. In essence, Fat Cavitation allows you to feel more comfortable in your body (and, in your clothing) once again.







Fizz (her stage name), keeps herself motivated and grounded through a loving and understanding


whenever she needs it (or even when she thinks she doesn't).



Dianne Kaye Alde is a female artist who trods the boards of the musical theatre stage. She is an innate interpreter, naturally relating to her audience. She sees them as active participants, not passive observers, in an artistic communion in the living story of a musical play on stage. As a musician and performer, she generously shares the emotional experience of her characters until the boundary between her and her audience blurs.

At the ripe age of 14, she sang Mariah Carey's "Fantasy" in her first performance. It was in a Vocal Eisteddfod - she prefers not to look back on that first taste of her craft (it makes her cringe, she says). Dianne, being a true achiever, is sensitive about what she does in the right way. She is inspired to simply keep using and honing her gifts. High school graduation found her at a crossroads in her career. Was she going to follow her mind by concentrating on her education or was she going to follow her heart and stay active in the theatre? She decided to take a gap year figuring it out – but that year brought her a teacher who has had a significant influence in her development. This teacher had a strict approach, had a blunt way of giving feedback, and rarely gave compliments. Dianne struggled to understand her intentions at first, but she eventually sort of let go and put her nose on the grindstone. Later, she would realize how the discipline her mentor taught her would play a huge role in shaping her work ethic and sense of drive. That time taught her to never take her talents for granted and enabled her to find the life balance between art, work and education - to continue doing the things that she loved doing.

Currently, she has a dual career as an educator and performer and, while at times it can be tough, she's vowed never to abandon her passions because she knows that these are vital parts of her person. Both careers co-exist: she's found to her advantage that she can access her artistic career and inspire creativity and self-expression through her teaching.

Among her most memorable performances was the first preview night of a local production of Hairspray. During this time, life was a huge rush; she was juggling several priorities since it was also her final year of University, and just a few weeks prior to the show, her grandmother passed away. Her grandmother played a very important role in her life, a person whom she admired and emulated to a certain degree. So it was a very difficult time. She remembers standing by the stage curtains, getting ready to go on, but instead of feeling anxious, she shifted her focus to making her grandmother proud if she had been watching, dedicating every performance to her. She went through her performances with a sense of overwhelming

peace, playing the difficult role of a "Dynamite Judine" with such professional ease. In a sense, her grandmother was with her, helping put the final, glittering touches on her extraordinary talent.

For the tireless theatre worker, there are still a lot of genres of musical theatre to experience or perform on the national and international stage. She also plans on writing her own music, to someday direct/produce shows, and opening up her own singing/performing arts academy. All the while, her extended family is incredibly supportive of her career, and they see her shows whenever they can. She sees support from her immediate family as a strong grounding on reality. Knowing how competitive her industry is, they are her team mates, picking her up when she is down, and keeping her focused on the bottom line - that the performance arts is a lot of hard work and has very little to do with grandiose expectations. They have instilled in her a tough resilience that takes her through any kind of criticism with easy grace - it is an awesome thing for her.

She's met many interesting people, and this is the result of putting herself in really unusual situations. She's worked in short films, theatre shows, print and TV commercials, and has even done a flash mob in one of the busiest parts of the city. The interesting, quirky personalities she meets in this career are one of the big reasons which make it worthwhile. But the honest, rural people in a small school 3-4 hours outside of Phuket, Thailand reside in her heart for giving her one of her most cherished experiences. She was there in 2012, in her final year of university, teaching English. She treasures her time there with the most generous, considerate and warm people who broke through the language barrier to make her feel truly appreciated as a person and teacher.

The most valuable lesson she's learnt is that if you're not willing to put 100% of yourself into your work, it's not worth doing. On the stage, Dianne feels that shyness is a selfish attribute because you're not giving your audience enough to respond to, and are therefore depriving them of having a full response. There is a Spanish term called "duende", which she loves. This word is refers to the "soul" in something, or the "amount of soul" put into a certain task, Billie Holiday is a singer she looks up to as you can really hear the "duende" in her voice; she experienced a lot of adversity in her life, and sang because it was a necessity and her livelihood, and not just any pastime or hobby. Dianne has made it her mission to continually seek and have duende in all aspects of her work. In terms of life in general, she abides by the saying, "Be kind to everyone you meet, for everyone is fighting their own battle". Everyone has a unique story, and there is so much hidden under face value. For her, kindness is a universal language that she can help re-teach people who have gotten out of touch of the most important of human values.
