


EDITOR'S NOTES

Less then two years ago Emma decided that she wanted to get into the modeling industry so she searched around for an agency that would take her even though she had such minimal experience. Royalle Modelling saw potential in Emma and took her on board, the agency pushed her in the right direction and helped her grow her modeling career quite faster and quicker. Ask any avid fan of the UFC who is the Greatest of All-time and they will probably tell you its George St. Pierre aka "GSP". He is a fighting spirit, personified and notorious for his champion status. A three-time former UFC Welterweight Champion who won the title twice and the interim title once between November 2006 and April 2008, Since December 13 2013, he held the longest record for most wins in title bouts and the second longest for "combined title streak" in the UFC history. Despite his track record in the UFC, he's a soft-spoken, level-headed intellect who happens to have an unparalleled love for dinosaurs. The G.O.A.T that is George St. Pierre was on an Australian speaking tour, talking about the hits and misses of his career, motivating and inspiring Down Under UFC fans in Sydney.

StarCentral magazine was lucky enough to meet with him and sat down for an exclusive interview and here's what went down:

StarCentral: Tell us about your journey. What's the secret to your success?

GSP: When you do something, you need to have fun and have a positive attitude, the best part of you needs to come out. Of course, there will always be times when things become stressful because there is no perfect job. However, 99.9% of the time, I'm just having fun and not regretting a single moment of it.

StarCentral: Were there times when you felt that you weren't going to make it"?

GSP: I always had doubts here and there because let's face it; there's no certainty in life. Confidence is something you have to work on in your mind, it's not something you are born with-no, it's something that you have to work on.

StarCentral: Have you ever been afraid of failure?

GSP: For me, I want to live likes it's my last day on Planet Earth. I don't want to have any regrets. I'm not afraid of failure, I'm not hoping to fail, but I am prepared to fail. If I fail since I'll just come back stronger next time. Failure is part of life. Failure is the greatest teacher.

StarCentral: Let's talk about success, when did you feel that you've reached the pinnacle of your success?

GSP: I haven't reached it [the pinnacle of my success], I think I have reached the point where I have achieved the greatest achievement that I can ever achieve, but I think I can still surpass that. There's always room for improvement.

StarCentral: Who would you want to fight that you think can be the biggest fight of your career?

GSP: Right now, I'm not ready to go yet but maybe, in a few months time, I would be. I don't know what the UFC landscape is going to be in a few months time, because you can never predict what will happen. Did you see what happened to Demetrious Johnson? He was known as the best-probably the best of all time. I was on the plane when I turned on my cell phone and got the text message about him losing - I was like "Wow that was unexpected."

StarCentral: Finally, if there were no rules for one day and you can do anything outrageous, what would you do?

GSP: I would probably like to control people's minds - to control the thoughts of living things and be the master of the universe. [Laughs]

On the 28th of July at the Fairfield School of Arts, Phoenix Eye celebrated their first year anniversary and launched their new magazine-esque channel, Yell-ohl TV, which consisted of film content, ranging from shortform documentaries, comedic skits, panel discussions and mindboggling animations etc.

Maria Tran, Theresa Chen and Nancy Trieu, the core team of Phoenix Eye were surrounded by a supportive group of friends and family, who were excited about their launch. Chit chat and laughter took place in an area so reminiscent of a typical Asian home, Instead of chairs, there were rows of cushions where everyone can sit and watch a medley of film content.

Yell-oh TV was born out of a communal spirit. An endearing and heartfelt community project pays homage to the early morning variety shows like Cheez TV!/Toasted TV that tickles the nostalgia of the early 2000's kid.

When asked about the mission behind Yell-oh! TV, Maria

"Basically, to let people have a go. At the same time, we realised amongst our own peers and the many people that we connect with, that they don't have a chance to be in front of the camera. So, we thought that we should reach out to people within our own networks. We asked them "hey, do you want to try presenting?" and they said, "They have never done it before."

"But, just because you never did it before, it doesn't mean you can't do it. We do have a bunch of amateurs together, we train them up and make them look good on camera

In between the cutaways of the 80's inspired fitness bit, bulk of it all was Phoenix Eye's amazing documentaries. The common denominating theme was demystifying the misconceptions of being Asian and tells a universal story of

vision, they are able to add a refreshing take, adding nuanced perspectives in overcoming adversity when it comes to assimilating into the Australian society.

One of those documentaries that were featured is Thuy Lavin's documentary, "Against the Grain," it featured Asians and Pacific-Islander Fashion designers talking about venturing into fashion and breaking away from the traditional route such as a lawyer, doctor, accountant or engineering.

When asked about the turning point when it comes to pursuing their passions within the creative field, more specifically in the screen industries, Therese, Maria and Nancy's journey were all very different.

For Nancy, it was stubbornness. She just couldn't settle for a 9-5 job because her visionary of becoming a creative is much stronger:

"My dad was stubborn and he is a creative too but he wanted me to get a job, because of security and all that. Deep down, I can never do it. There are people that can do the 9-5 grind and enjoy it, but it's not for me. Through all the hurdles, I'm actually enjoying what I do, even though it's a lot tougher, it's more rewarding."

For Maria, it was mental health and bullying and she didn't feel like she had a voice. The turning point in her life was when she realised that she either has to fold or rise up to challenge:

"The turning point was that I don't want to live like this, I don't want to be bullied and live with this quiet voice. So, therefore in high school, I went the complete opposite and got completely loud -- ridiculously out of context loud, which was really bizarre. Then with a social context, I decided to fine-tune it to work in my favour.

"I have some friends that go down the traditional route,

when I connected with them recently, they're not any happier. They are stuck in a box and they have this quiver in their voice But that's okay, that's their journey - at any point they can choose to break out of the box."

For Therese, it was a realisation that she wasn't happy in her 9-5 job. Initially, she did a science degree because she thought it was the more secure option. However, it was the hollowness that propels her to pursue her love for

"I had this question popping repeatedly in my head, 'is this it??' If you keep asking this question on a daily basis then what you're doing is not working, it's making you feel empty. Eventually, after a couple months, I was let go. It didn't feel good at the time, but it was for the best. I remembered afterwards that I liked films and so, I got out the camera and Maria found me on Facebook."

Eventually, all good things must come to an end. The Yell-oh TV launch was very lively from start to finish. There was cake. There was laughter. There was also an unparalleled sense of ambitious frolicking in the room.

So what's next for Phoenix Eye and Yell-oh TV? Maria hinted on producing something groundbreaking—an all-female action film starring an Asian female protagonist!

"We have the capabilities to do it but we don't have the full resources yet. Once we get the resources, we will get on it and hopefully, it will make an impact."





Congratulations to Melody David and her team for organising such an entertaining event.






Miss Russia Australia 2018 at the Stamford Plaza Sydney Airport
